

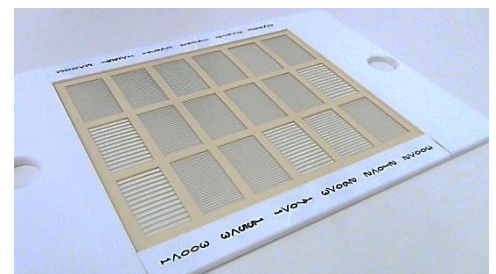


## Tactile Discrimination Test (TDT): Portable unit

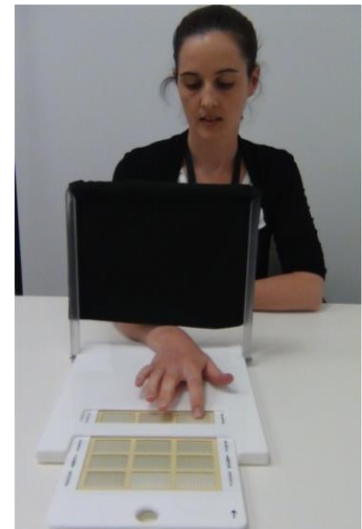
The Tactile Discrimination Test (TDT) is a quantitative, standardised measure of touch discrimination appropriate for testing touch sensation in a clinical setting.

### Tactile Discrimination Test (TDT) – Portable Version

Comprises texture plate and delivery unit necessary for assessment.

The portable TDT comprises a smaller sized version of the original and a carry case. It is designed to be easily transportable and require minimal set up.
